

### UNM Men of Color Initiative (MOCI) 2012-2013 Fact Sheet

The University of New Mexico (UNM) Men of Color Initiative (MOCI) was created in 2011 and is led by the UNM Division for Equity & Inclusion (DEI) in partnership with campus departments, student clubs and community organizations as well as student leaders, faculty, staff and community to increase access and success for male students of color at the university and in the educational pipeline of community college and K-12 schools. In 2012-2013 the UNM MOCI will:

- 1) gather and share **data** and research, including qualitative data of best practices and student stories as well as quantitative data, on access and success for men of color at UNM and higher education
- 2) connect campus and community partners in a **working group** to address and take action on access and success for male students of color including collaborative projects
- 3) support and sustain a **student-led model leadership and mentoring project**, the Men of Color Alliance, for access and success for male students of color at the university
