# Needs Assessment Survey to LGBTQIA+ Staff and Faculty

- Administered by DEI and the LGBTQ Resource Center (RC) via Qualtrics software
- The RC survey was open 4.19.22-5.11.22.
- 360 individuals began the survey and 289 provided their consent to continue the survey.
- Over 200 answered all or most demographic questions.
- Individuals who do not identify as LGBTQIA or as individuals for whom sexual orientation, gender identity, and expression (SOGIE) status is salient were removed from the substantive analysis. This resulted in a reduction to 186 respondents.
- Survey language for all but one response was English.

Notes: Latinidad was described expansively by respondents. Examples included NuevoMexicana/o/e/x, Chicana/o/e/x, Mexicana/o/e/x American, Mexicana/o/e/x, Puerto Rican, etc. These responses were "check all that apply". Due to ability to check all that apply all responses were fewer than 10, with exception of Mexicana/o/e/x American (14 responses).

Note: Race was "check all that apply", resulting in few categories per cell. Race was asked separately from Hispanic Ethnicity. In response to race, 156 respondents indicated white only, 7 included American Indian alone or in addition to other categories, 10 AAPI alone or in addition to other categories, 6 Black alone or in addition to other categories, and 20 Multiracial alone or in addition to other categories. Three respondents said they did not see themselves listed. All constructive open-ended responses to race indicated they were Latino, Hispanic, or from Spain.
